ODDS AND ENDS ABOUT THE WIG PROJECT and SUCH Edited comments from Mark Dillon:

The first shipment of wig stands was delivered to cCare Cancer Center the last week of May, with a second delivery the last week in June. The administrator of the wig program was taken back with the high quality of work and is very grateful for the donations. She is now issuing the stands to cancer patients.

To date the Sequoia WoodTurners have made 84 wig stands... Awesome Job!

Wipe-On-Poly or rattle-can Poly are the finishes of choice. Non-hardening oils such as mineral oil should be <u>avoided</u> as the oil can transfer into the wig. Also, woods that have a strong odor such as Deodar Cedar should also be avoided due to the smell permeating the wig. A rule of thumb is if the wood is stinky or sticky, don't use it. Oily woods such as teak, cocobolo and even olive can be problematic. Not only can the oil in the wood slow down or prevent a proper glue-up but if you use some of the above suggested finishes, the finish might not cure properly. Here is a link for the Wood Online Database should you have a question. I realize some of the listed woods are exotic and would not be used anyway. Currently I am using lumber laying around my shop to construct the stands. A 6" x 6" x 2", 5" x 5" x 2" and a 12" to 14" x 2" spindle piece isn't a whole bunch of wood for me, but I will run out in time. We have established three sources of lumber for this project, so no one that wishes to participate in making the stands needs to use their own lumber. I still have a chainsaw and there is no doubt I will get some support from my local arborists who harvest trees for a living. Most of them know me by name already. Should you have any contacts as I have just mentioned, pitch the idea to them. If we can develop a good supply of materials, that will make this project so much easier. Thank you again everyone.
